Club Official

The club will appoint two Welfare Officers, one male & one female, with the specific responsibility of implementing this policy. The name and contact of the appointed person will be included in the Policy document and clearly displayed on the Centurion RC website.

The Welfare Officers will be trained to the standards required by UK Athletics.

Coaches

All coaches must be cleared through the police check self-vetting system i.e. the Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) which helps the club make safer recruitment decisions and is updated every 3 years.
